DORA Info.

- Established in 2015 by State of Ohio
- Program is controlled by Ohio Dept of Commerce / Liquor Control division
- The creation of a DORA is meant to serve as an economic tool to attract patrons to downtown Amherst and highlight the area as a destination for dining and entertainment
- How many DORAs can we have?

Population 50k or less	Maximum #	Maximum size	Minimum Qualified Permit holders in zone
50,000 or less	3	Up to 320 contiguous acres	Two, or more

- City Council approves days, hours and boundaries.
- Mayor and Police can stop a DORA event if needed

Ohio has 123 DORA locations.

- Milan
- Sandusky
- Norwalk
- Lorain

Some are special events only; some prohibit DORA during special events. Hours and Days are tailored by each city

DORA, Big Picture

- Proposed by Main Street Amherst in 2022
- DORA <u>conditionally</u> modifies open container laws
- ✓ ORC 4301.62
- ✓ Adults 21+
- ✓ Alcoholic beverages served by a participating bar/restaurant in area
- ✓ Within a designated area & participating business
- ✓ During designated times
- ✓ First to last sip of beverage must be drank outside

DORA, Safety and Security

Police Chief Mark Cawthon

DORA, recent local events

 First discussed at City Council summer of 2022 and killed after two readings

- Notion was revisited with local bar owners & MSA in December 2022.
- Later disused with City Administration, Police and Fire Officials, other DORA cities and interested/impacted local business

DORA, recent events

- Decision made to reintroduce the DORA legislation
 - As a test
 - During Downtown events
 - Limited area, within the area that is blocked off during the special events.
- Future of the DORA should be owned by the business it is intended to help
 - Input of the community and city safety forces.
 - Changes to DORA approved by City Council, three public readings is required.
 - It is NOT Dancing on Mainstreet

DORA, quick rules

- Beverages must be sold in designated cups
- Beverages must be drunk within designated area
- Alcohol must be sold by one of the permitted 'bars'
- 'BYOB' is not permitted...Nuff said!
- Beverages can be taken into retail establishments if allowed by owner
- Beverages cannot be taken from one 'bar' to another 'bar'
 - First sip to last must be drank outside or participating retail establishment

DORA, Local Business

Main Street Amherst Teresa Gilles, Executive Director

DORA – Proposed Pilot Project

Special Events Only

- Summer of 2023
- Store fronts and street of blocked off streets
- Not allowed in Parking Lots
- Safety Service Director is custodian of dates
- Must be reviewed, renewed, modified by City Council within the first year, but can be modified prior to that date
- Public Safety is priority, police and mayor have power to react to issues.
- MSA Director
